THE TWO WITNESSES.

THE suppression of the Scriptures under the dominion of Rome, the terrible results of that suppression, and the final exaltation of the word of God, are vividly portrayed by the prophetic pencil. To John the exile on lonely Patmos was given a view of the 1260 years during which the papal power was permitted to trample upon God's word and oppress his people. Said the angel of the Lord: "The holy city [the true church] shall they tread under foot forty and two months. And I will give power unto my two witnesses, and they shall prophesy a thousand two hundred and threescore days, clothed in sack-cloth." Rev.11:2,3. The periods here mentioned are the same, alike representing the time in which God's faithful witnesses remained in a state of obscurity.

The two witnesses represent the Old and New Testament Scriptures. Both are important testmonies to the origin and perpetuity of the law of God. Both are witnesses also to the plan of salvation. The types, sacrifices, and prophecies of the Old Testament point forward to a Saviour to come. The Gospels and Epistles of the New Testament tell of a Saviour who has come in the exact manner foretold by type and prophecy.

"Of all the gifts that heaven can bestow upon man, fellowship with Christ in His sufferings is the most weighty trust and the highest honor."

"These are the two olive trees, and the two candlesticks standing before the God of the earth." Rev.11:4. Said the psalmist, "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path." PS. 119:105.

The papal power sought to hide from the people the word of truth, and set before them false witnesses to contradict its testimony. When the Bible was proscribed by religious and secular authority; when its testimony was perverted, and every effort made SR7 its testimony was perverted, and every effort made SB7: that men and demons could invent to turn the minds 59 of the people from it; when those who dared pro-claim its sacred truths were hunted, betrayed, tort-urd, buried in dungeon cells, martyred for their faith, or compelled to flee to mountain fastnesses and to dens and caves of the earth,—then indeed did the faithful witnesses prophesy in sackcloth.

But men cannot with impunity trample upon the word of God. The Lord had declared concerning his two witnesses, "If any man will hurt them fire proceedeth out of their mouth, and devoureth their enemies; and if any man will hurt them, he must in this manner be killed." Rev.11:5. The meaning of this fearful denunciation is set forth in the closing chapter of the book of Revelation: "I testify unto every man that heareth the words of the prophesy of this book, If any man shall add unto these things, God shall add unto him the plagues that are written in this book. And if any man shall take away from the words of the book of this prophesy, God shall take away his part out of the book of life, and out of the holy city, and from the things which are written in this book."

"In the book of God's remembrance every deed of righteousness is immortalised. There every temptation resisted, every evil overcome, every word of tender pity expressed, is faithfully chronicled. And every act of sacrifice, every suffering and sorrow endured for Christ's sake, is recorded."

Such are the warnings which God has given to guard men against changing in any manner that which he has revealed or commanded. These solemn denunciations apply to all who by their influence lead men to lighly regard the (law) of God. They should cause those fear and tremble who flippantly declare it a matter of little consequence whether we obey God's law or not. All who exalt their own opinions above the written word, all who would change the plain meaning of Scriptures to suit their own convenience, or for the sake of conformity to the world, are taking upon themselves a fearful responsibility. The written word, the law of God, will measure the character of every man, and condemn all whom this unerring test shall declare wanting.

Notwithstanding the Lord's witnesses were clothed in sackcloth, they continued to prophesy throughout the entire period of 1260 years. In the darkest times there were faithful men who loved God's word, and were jealous for his honor. To these loyal servants were given wisdom, power, and authority to declare

his truth during the whole of this time.

"And when they shall have finished their testimony, the beast that ascendeth out of the bottomless pit shall make war against them, and shall overcome them, and kill them. And their dead bodies shall lie in the street of the great city, which spiritually is called Sodom and Egypt, where also our Lord was crucified." Rev.11:7,8.

These events were to take place near the close of the period in which the witnesses testified in sackcloth. Through the medium of the papacy, Satan

had long controlled the powers that ruled in Church and State. The fearful results were especially apparent in those countries that rejected the light of the Reformation. There was a state of moral debasement and corruption similar to the condition of Sodom just prior to its destruction, and to the idolatry and spiritual darkness that prevailed in Egypt in the days of Moses.

In no land had the spirit of enmity against Christ and the truth been more strikingly displayed than in giddy and godless France. Nowhere had the gospel encountered more bitter and cruel opposition. In the streets of Paris, Christ had indeed been crucified in the person of his saints. The world still recalls with shuddering horror the scenes of that most cowardly and cruel onslaught, the Massacre of St. Bartholomew The king of France, urged on by Romish Priests and prelates, lent his sanction to the dreadful work. The palace bell, tolling at midnight, gave the signal for the slaughter to begin. Protestants by thousands, sleeping quietly in their homes, trusting to the plighted honor of their king, were dragged forth without a warning, and murdered in cold blood.

Satan, in the person of Roman zealots, led the van. As Christ was the invisible leader of his people from Egyptian bondage, so was Satan the unseen leader of his subjects in this horrible work of multiplying martyrs. For three days the butchery went on; more than thirty thousand perished. The result caused great joy to the hosts of darkness. The Roman pontiff, sharing in the diabolocal rejoicing, proclaimed a jubilee to be observed throughout his

dominions, to celebrte the event.

The same master-spirit that urged on the Massacre of St. Bartholomew, led also in the scenes of the French Revolution. Satan seemed to triumph, Notwithstanding the labors of the Reformers, he had succeeded in holding vast multitudes in ignorance concerning God and his word. Now he appeared in new quise. In France arose an atheistical power that openly declared war against the authority of Heaven. Men threw off all restraint. The law God was trampled under foot. Those who could engage in the most Heaven-daring blasphemy and the most abominable wickedness were most highly exalted. Fornication was sanctioned by law. Profanity and corruption seemed deluging the earth. In all this, supreme homage was paid to Satan, while Christ, in his characteristics of truth, purity, and unselfish love, was crucified. The Bible was publicly burned. The Sabbath was blotted out. Romanism had enjoined image worship; now divine honors were paid to the vilest objects. The work which the papacy had begun, atheism completed. The one withheld from the people the truths of the Bible; the other taught them to reject both the Bible and its Author. The seed sown by priests and prelates was yielding its evil fruit.

Terrible indeed was the condition of infide France. The word of truth lay dead in her streets, and those who hated the restrictions and requirements of God's law were jubilant. But trangression and rebellion were followed by the sure result. Unhappy France—reaped in blood the harvest she had sown. The war against the Bible and the law of God banished peace and happiness from the hearts and homes of men.

"In the church would manifest a greater interest in the reforms which God Himself has brought to them to fit them for His coming, their influence would be tenfold what it now is." Test. vol. 3, p. 171. No one was secure: he who triumphed to-day was suspected, condemned, to-morrow. Violence and terror reigned supreme. The land was filled with crimes

too horrible for pen to trace.

God's faithful witnesses were not long to remain silent. "The Spirit of life from God entered into them, and they stood upon their feet, and great fear fell upon them which saw them." Rev.11:11. The world stood aghast at the enormity of guilt which had resulted from a rejection of the Sacred Oracles, and men were glad to return once more to faith in God and his word.

Concerning the two witnesses the prophet declares further, "And they heard a great voice from Heaven saying unto them, Come up hither. And they ascended up to heaven in a cloud; and their enemies beheld them." Rev.11:12. Since the French Revolution the word of God has been honored as never before. The Bible has been translated into nearly every language spoken by men, and scattered over every part of the globe. After being, as it were, thrust down to hell, it has, in truth, been exalted to heaven.

Those who received the great blessings of the Reformation did not go forward in the path so nobly entered upon by Luther. A few faithful men arose from time to time, to proclaim new truth, and expose long-cherished error; but the majority, like the lews in Christ's day; or the papists in the time of Luther, (were) content to believe as their (fathers) believed, and to live as they lived Therefore religion again degenerated into formalism; and errors and superstitions which would have been cast had (the) church continued to walk in the light of God's word, were retained and cherished. Thus the (spirit) inspired by the Reformation gradually died out, until there was almost as great a need of reform in the Protestant churches as in the Roman Church in the time of Luther. There was the same spiritual stupor, the same respect for the opinions of men, the same spirit of worldliness, the same substitution of human theories for the teachings of God's word. Pride and extravagance were fostered under the guise of religion. The churches became corrupted by allying themselves with the world. Thus were degraded the great principles for which Luther and his fellow-laborerd had done and suffered so much.

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He who knows the end from the beginning, and who inspired prophets and apostles to write the future history of churches and of nations, was about to accomplish another reform similar to that of the days of Lother. God had committed these prophecies to the Jewish leaders; therefore they were without excuse if they did not know and declare to the people that



Every day we may advance in perfection of christian Character. For this Christ clothed His Divinity with humanity. For this He came to the earth, and lived a life of suffering and privation.

But let no one think that it is possible for human beings in their own power to reach the standard that God presents before them. Our hearts are evil, and we cannot change them. "Who can bring a clean thing out of an unclean? Not one." "The carnal mind is enmity against God: for it is not subject to the law of God, neither indeed can be." Education, culture, the exercise of the will, HUMAN EFFORT, all have their proper sphere: but here they are POWERLESS. They may produce an outward correctness of behaviour, but they cannot change the HEART: they cannot PURIFY the SOUL. There must be a POWER working from WITHIN, a NEW LIFE from above, BEFORE man be CHANGED from sin to Holiness. That Power is CHRIST. His GRACE ALONE can quicken the lifeless FACULTIES of the SOUL, and attract it to God, to Holiness.

THE ONE GREAT LESSON ALL MUST LEARN—the poor sinner dead in trespasses and sins, AND the bPROFESSING Christian, who had known Christ, but has clung to his sins—is that Christ will save to the uttermost all who come to Him. "Him that cometh to Me," He says, "I will in no wish cast out." The POOR, the SUFFERING, the SINFUL, may find in Christ all they NEED. As soon as they receive Jesus as their PERSONAL SAVIOUR, the cries of distress and woe are changed to songs of PRAISE and THANKSGIVING.

When the sinner feels his NEED of the Sun of Righteousness, when he comes to Jesus saying, "L'ord, I am SINFUL, UNWORTHY, HOPELESS, and HELPLESS: save me, or I perish," he is accepted in the Beloved. He learns what it means to sit in Heavenly **Places** in Christ Jesus. God says, "Let there be LIGHT," and there is LIGHT. The HEART once darkened by sin is IRRADIATED by the PRESENCE of Him who is the LIGHT of LIFE.

God is ever seeking to bring human MINDS into association with the DIVINE. He offers us the PRIVILEGE of CO-OPERATION with Christ in revealing His GRACE to the world, that we may receive an INCREASED KNOWLEDGE of Heavenly things. Looking unto Jesus we obtain BRIGHTER and MORE DISTINCT VIEWS of GOD, and beholding we become CHANGED. Goodness, love for our fellow-men, becomes our natural instinct. We DEVELOP A CHARACTER that is the counterpart of the Divine Character. Growing into His likeness, we enlarge our capacity for knowing God. More and more we enter into FELLOWSHIP with the Heavenly world, and WE HAVE CONTINUALLY IN-CREASING POWER to receive the riches of the KNOWLEDGE and WISDOM of ETERNITY. WE ALL, with open face beholding as in a glass the Glory of the Lord, are CHANGED INTO THE SAME IMAGE FROM GLORY TO GLORY, even by THE SPIRIT of the Lord." (II Corinthians 3:12).

ALL MANUEL

The disciples did not ask for a blessing for themselves. They were weighted with the burdens of souls. The gospel was to be carried to the ends of the earth, and they claimed the endowment of power that Christ had promised. Then it was that the Holy Spirit was poured out, and thousands were converted in a day. So it may be now. Let Christians put away all dissension, and give themselves to God for the saving of the lost. Let them ask in Faith for the promised blessing, and it will come.

The outpouring of the Spirit in the days of the apostles was the "former rain," and glorious was the result. But the "latter rain" will be more abundant. What is the promise to those living in these last days? -"Turn ye to the strong hold, ye prisoners of hope: even to-day do I declare that I will render double unto thee." "Ask ye of the Lord rain in the time of the latter rain: so the Lord shall make bright clouds, and give them showers of rain, to every one grass in the field." Zach. 9: 12, 10:1.

CHRIST'S MOST ESSENTIAL GIFT TO HIS CHURCH (Reading for Friday, May 7, 1909)

Before offering Himself as the sacrifical victim, Christ sought for the most essential and complete gift to bestow upon His followers, a gift that would bring within their reach the boundless resources of grace "I will pray the Father," He said, "and He will give you another Comforter, that He may abide with you forever: even the Spirit of truth; whom the world cannot receive, because it seeth (Him) not, neither knoweth (Him: but ye know (Him; for (He) dwelleth with you, and shall be in you. I will not leave you orphans: I will come to you.

Before this the (Spirit) had been in the world: from the very beginning of the work of redemption (He) had been moving upon men's hearts. But while Christ was on earth, the disciples had desired no other helper. Not until they were deprived of His presence would they feel the need of the Spirit, and then (He) would come.

The Holy Spirit is Christ's representative, but divested of the personality of humanity, and independent thereof. Cumbered with humanity, Christ could not be in every place personally. Therefore it was for their interest that He should go to the Father, and send the (Spirit) to be His (successor) on earth. No one could then have any advantage because of his location or his personal contact with Christ. By the Spirit the Saviour would be accessible to all. In this sense He would be nearer to them than if He had not ascended on high.

The Comforter is called "the Spirit of truth" (His work is to define and maintain the truth. (He) first dwells in the heart as the Spirit of truth, and thus He becomes the Comforter. There is comfort and peace in the truth, but no real peace or comfort can be found in falsehood. It is through false theories, and traditions that Satan gains his power over the mind. By directing men to false standards, he misshapes the character. Through the Scriptures, the Holy Spirit speaks to the mind, and impresses truth upon the heart.

Thus He exposes error and expels it from the soul It is by the Spirit of truth, working through the word of God, that Christ subdues His chosen people to Himself.

In describing to His disciples the office work of the Holy Spirit, Jesus sought to inspire them with the joy and hope that inspired His own heart. He rejoiced because of the abundant help He had provided for His church. The Holy Spirit was the highest of all (gifts) that He could solicit from His Father for the exaltation of His people. The Spirit was to be given as a regenerating agent, and without this the sacrifice of Christ would have been of no avail. The power of evil had been strengthening for centuries, and the submission of men to this satanic captivity was amazing. Sin could be resisted and overcome only through the mighty agency of the third person of the Godhead, who would come with no modified energy, but in the fullness of divine power. It is the Spirit that makes effectual what has been wrought out by the world's Redeemer. It is by the Spirit that the heart is made pure. Through the Spirit the believer becomes a partaker of the divine nature. Christ has given (His) Spirit as a divine power to overcome all hereditary and cultivated tendencies to evil, and to impress His own character on His church.

Of the Spirit, Jesus said, He shall glorify Me." The Saviour came to glorify the Father by the demonstration of His love; so the Spirit was to glorify Christ by revealing His grace to the world. The very image of God is to be reproduced in humanity. The honour of God, the honour of Christ is involved in the perfection of the character of His people.

"When He the Spirit of truth is come, He will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment." The preaching of the Word will be of no avail without the continual presence and aid of the Holy Spirit. This is the only effectual teacher of divine trith. Only when the truth is accompanied to the heart by the Spirit, will it quicken the conscience or transform the life. One might be able to present the letter of the Word of God, he might be familiar with all its commands and promises; but unless the Holy Spirit sets home the truth, no soul will fall on

the Rock and be broken. No amount of education, no advantages, however great, can make one a channel of light without the co-operation of the Spirit of God. The sowing of the gospel seed will not be a success unless the seed is quickened into life by the dew of heaven. Before one book of the New Testament was written, before the one gospel sermon had been preached after Christ's ascension, the Holy Spirit came upon the praying apostles. Then the testimony of their enemies was, "Ye have filled Jerusalem with your doctrine."

Christ has promised that gift of the Holy Spirit to His church, and the promise belongs to us as much as to the first disciple. But like every other promise, it is given on conditions. There are many who believe and profess to claim the Lord's promises; they talk about Christ and the Holy Spirit, yet receive no benefit. They do not surrender the soul to be guided and controlled by divine agencies. We cannot use the Holy Spirit. The Spirit is to use us. Ihrough the Spirit, God works in His people "to will and to do of His good pleasure." But many will not submit to this. They want to manage themselves. This is why they do not receive the heavenly gift. Only to those who wait humbly upon God, who watch for His guidance and grace, is the Spirit given. This promised blessing, claimed by faith, brings all other blessings in its train. It is given according to the riches of the grace of Christ, and He is ready to supply every soul according to the capacity to receive.

When the Spirit of God takes possession of the heart, it transforms the life. Sinful thoughts are put away, evil deeds are renounced; love, humility, and peace take the place of anger, envy, and strife. Joy takes the place of sadness, and the countenance reflects the joy of heaven. No one sees the hand that lifts the burden, or beholds the light descend from the courts above. The blessing comes when by faith the soul surrenders itself to God. Then that power which no human eye can see, creates a new being in the image of God.

The Holy Spirit is the breath of spiritual life in the (soul). The impartation of the Spirit is the impartation of the (life) of Christ. It imbues the

receiver with the attributes of Christ. Only those who are thus taught of God, those who possess the inward working of the Spirit, and in whose life the Christ-life is manifested, are to stand as representative men, to minister in behalf of the church.

The religion that comes from God is the only religion that will lead to God. In order to serve Him aright, we must be born of the divine Spirit. This will purify the heart and renew the mind, giving us a new capacity for knowing and loving God. It will give us a willing obedience to all His requirements. This is true worship. It is the fruit of the working of the Holy Spirit. By the Spirit every sincere prayer is indited, and such prayer is acceptable to God. Wherever a soul reaches out after God, there the Spirit's working is manifest, and God will reveal Him-self to that soul. For such worshipers He is seeking. He awaits to receive them, and to make them His sons and daughters.

God takes men as they are, and educates them for His service, if they will yield themselves to Him. The Spirit of God, received into the soul, will quicken all the faculties. Under the guidance of the (Holy) (Spirit, the mind that is devoted unreservedly to God, develops harmonously, and is strengthened to comprehend and fulfil the requirements of God. The weak, vacillating character becomes changed to one of strength and steadfastness. Continual devotion establishes so close a relation between Jesus and His disciple that the Christian becomes like Him in mind and character. Through a connection with Christ he will have clearer and broader views. His discernment will be more penetrative, his judgment better balanced. He who longs to be of service to Christ is so quickened by the life giving power of the Sun of Righteousnes, that he is enabled to bear much fruit to the (glory) of God.

The first disciples went forth preaching the Word. They revealed Christ in their lives. And the Lord worked with them, "confirming the Word with signs following," These disciples prepared themselves for their work. Before the day of Pentecost they met together, and put away all differences. They were of one accord. They believed Christ's promise that the

blessing would be given, and they prayed in faith. They did not ask for a blessing for themselves merely: they were weighted with the <u>burden for the salvation of souls</u>. The gospel was to be carried to the uttermost parts of the earth, and they claimed the endowment of power that Christ has promised. Then it was that the <u>Holy Spirit was poured out</u>, and thousands were converted in a day.

So it may be now. Instead of man's spectulations, let the Word of God be preached. Let Christians put away their dissensions, and give themselves to God for the saving of the lost. Let them in faith ask for the blessing, and it will come. The outpouring of the Spirit in apostalic days was the "former rain," and glorious was the result. But the latter rain will be more abundant.

All who consecrate soul, body, and spirit to God, will be constantly receiving a new endowment of physical and mental power. The inexhaustible supply of heaven are at their command. Christ gives them the breath of His own Spirit, the life of His own life. The Holy Spirit puts its highest energies to work the heart and mind. The grace of God enlarges and multiplies their faculties, and every perfection of the divine nature comes to their assistance in the work of saving souls. Through co-operation with Christ they are complete in Him, and in their human weakness they are enabled to do the deeds of Omnipotence."

Why do we not hunger and thirst for the gift of the Spirit, since this is the means by which we are to receive power? Why do we not talk of it, pray for it, preach concerning it? The Lord is more willing to give the Holy Spirit to us than parents are to give good gifts to their children. For the baptism of the Spirit every worker should be pleading with God. Companies should be gathered together to ask for special help, for heavenly wisdom, that they may know how to plan and execute wisely. Especially should men pray that God will baptise His missionaries with the Holy Spirit.

THE HOLY SPIRIT AN AID IN BIBLE STUDY.

The HOLY SPIRIT has been given as an AID in the STUDY of God's WORD. Jesus promised, "The COMFORTER, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the FATHER will send in My NAME. HE shall teach you ALL THINGS, and bring all things to your REMEMBRANCE, whatsoever I have said unto you." Those who are under the TRAINING of the HOLY SPIRIT, will be able to TEACH the WORD INTELLI-GENTLY. When the Bible is made the book of study, with earnest supplication for the SPIRIT'S GUIDANCE, and a FULL SURRENDER of the HEART to be SANCTIFIED THROUGH THE TRUTH, it will accomplish all that God has promised.

The RESULTS of such study will be WELL BALANCED MINDS. The UNDERSTANDING WILL BE QUICKENED, the SENSibilities will be AROUSED: the CONSCIENCE will become SENSITIVE: the SYMPATHIES and SENTIMENTS will be PUR-IFIED: a better moral armosphere will be created; and a NEW POWER TO RESIST TEMPTATION WILL BE IMPARTED.

The KNOWLEDGE of God is not to be gained without MENTAL EFFORT, without PRAYER for WISDOM. We should search, diligently search for its hidden treasures, and seek WISDOM from heaven that we may be able to DISTINGUISH between HUMAN INVENTIONS and the DIVINE COMMANDS. The HOLY SPIRIT will AID the SEEKER for great and precious TRUTHS which relate to the PLAN of REDEMPTION. A CASUAL reading of the SCRIPTURES is not enough. We must SEARCH, and this implies a DOING of all that the WORD implies. As the miner eagerly explores the earth to discover its veins of gold, so we are to EXPLORE THE WORD OF GOD FOR THE HIDDEN TREA-SURES that Satan has so long sought to hide from man. The Lord says, "IF ANY MAN WILL DO HIS WILL, HE SHALL KNOW OF THE DOCTRINES."

The greatest ERROR of the ROMISH CHURCH is found in the fact that the Bible is interpreted IN THE LIGHT OF THE OPINIONS OF THE "FATHERS." These OPINIONS are regarded as INFALLIBLE, and the DIGITARIES of the CHURCH ASSUME that it is in their prerogative to make others believe as they do. THOSE that DO NOT AGREE WITH THEM are pronounced HERETICS. But the Word of God is not thus to be interpreted. It is to stand on its own ETERNAL MERITS, to be read as the Word of God, which declares His WILL to the people.

The blessed Bible gives us a KNOWLEDGE of the great PLAN of SALVATION, and shows us how every INDIVIDUAL may have Eternal Life. Who is the author of the Book? JESUS CHRIST. He is the TRUE WITNESS, and He says to His own, "I give unto you them Eternal Life: and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of My hand." The Bible shows us the WAY to Christ, and in Christ Eternal Life is REVEALED. Jesus said to the JEWS, and to those who gathered about Him in MULT-ITUDES, "SEARCH the SCRIPTURES." The JEWS HAD THE SCRIPTURES which testified of Christ, but they were not able to discern Christ in the Scriptures. The TRUTHS of the OLD TESTAMENT they had so mingled with HUMAN OPINIONS that His Teaching were MYSTIFIED, and the WILL of God to man covered up. Christ's SERMON on the mount virtually CONTRADICTED the DOCTRINES of the SELF-RIGHTEOUS SCRIBES and PHARISEES. They had so MIS-REPRESENTED God that He was looked upon as a STERN JUDGE, INCAPABLE OF COMPASSION, MERCY, or LOVE. They presented to the people ENDLESS MAXIMS and TRADITIONS that had no "Thus saith the Lord" for their authority. Though they professed to know and worship the true and living God, THEY WHOLLY MISREPRESENTED HIM AND HIS CHARACTER as revealed in His SON. Christ laboured constantly to sweep away these MISREPRESENTATIONS, that the confidence of men in the love of God might be restored. He taught man to address the supreme Ruler by THE NEW NAME "OUR FATHER." This name represents our true relation to Him, and when spoken sincerely by human lips, it is MUSIC IN THE EARS OF GOD. Christ leads us to the THRONE of God by a NEW AND LIVING WAY.

MEN NEED NOT THE DIM LIGHT OF TRADITION AND CUSTOM to make the Scriptures comprehensible. It is just as sensible to suppose that the sun, shining in the heavens at noonday, needs the glimmerings of the torchlights of earth to increase its glory. In the Bible every DUTY is made plain, every LESSON is comprehensible. The GIFT of CHRIST and the ILLUMINATION of the HOLY SPIRIT reveal to us the Father. The WORD is able to make men and women and youth WISE unto salvation. "ALL Scripture is given by Inspiration of God, and is profitable FOR DOCTRINE, FOR REPROOF, FOR CORRECTION, FOR INSTRUCTION IN RIGHTEOUSNESS: that the man of God

may be PERFECT, throughly furnished unto ALL GOOD WORKS." No other book is so potent to elevate the thoughts, to give vigour to the FACULTIES, as the broad, ennobling TRUTHS of the Bible. IF GOD'S WORD WERE STUDIED AS IT SHOULD BE, men would have a BREADTH of MIND, a NOBILITY OF CHARACTER, and a STABILITY OF PURPOSE that is rarely seen in these times.

LITTLE BENEFIT is to be derived from a HASTY READ-ING of the Scriptures. One may read the whole Bible through, and yet fail to see its BEAUTY or COMPREHEND ITS DEPTH OF MEANING. One message studied until its significance is clear of the mind, and its relation to the PLAN of Salvation evident, is of MORE VALUE than the PERUSAL of many chapters with no DEFINITE PURPOSE in view and no POSITIVE INSTRUCTION GAINED. Keep your Bible with you. As you have Opportunity, READ IT: fix the TEXTS in your MEMORY. Even while you are walking in the street, you may read a passage and meditate upon it, thus fixing it on the MIND.

NEVER should the Bible be studied WITHOUT PRAYER. BEFORE opening its pages, WE SHOULD ASK FOR THE ENLIGHTMENT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT, and IT WILL BE GIVEN. When Nathanial came to Jesus, the Saviour exclaimed, "Behold an ISRAELITE indeed, in whom is NO QUILE." Nathaniel said, "Whence knowest Thou me?' Jesus answered, "Before that Philip called thee, when thou wast under the fig-tree, I saw thee." AND JESUS WILL SEE US ALSO IN THE SECRET PLACE OF PRAYER. If we will seek Him for LIGHT, ANGELS FROM THE WORLD OF LIGHT will be with those who in HUMILITY of HEART SEEK for DIVINE GUIDANCE.

The HOLY SPIRIT exalts and glorifies the Saviour. It is His OFFICE to present Christ, the PURITY of His RIGHTEOUSNESS, and the great SALVATION that we have through Him. Jesus says, "HE shall receive of Mine, and shall show it unto you." "The SPIRIT of Truth is the ONLY EFFECTUAL TEACHER OF DIVINE TRUTH." Mrs. E. G. WHITE.

No one can <u>believe</u> with the heart unto righteousness, and <u>obtain</u> justification by faith, while continuing the practice of those things which the Word of God

forbids, or while neglecting any known duty.

Genuine faith will be manifested in good works; for good works are the fruits of faith. As God works in the heart, and men surrenders his will to God, and cooperate with God, he works out in the life what God works in by the Holy Spirit, and there is harmony between the purpose of the heart and the practice of the life. Every sin must be renounced as the hateful thibng that crucified the Lord of life and glory, and the believer must have a progressive experience by continual doing the works of Christ. It is by continual surrender of the will, by continual obedience, that the blessing of justification is retained.

Imputation of the righteousness of Christ comes through justifying faith, and is the justification for which Paul so earnestly contends. He says "Therefore by the deeds of the law there shall no flesh be justified in his sight: for by the law is the know-ledge of sin. SM 1:396-7

PRAY FOR THE LATTER RAIN

"Ask ye of the Lord Rain in the time of the latter Rain: so the Lord shall make bright clouds, and give them showers of Rain." "He will cause to come down for you the Rain, the former Rain, and the latter Rain. In the East the former rain falls at the sowning time. It is necessary in order that the seed may germinate. Under the influence of the fertilizing Showers, the tender shoots spring up. The Latter rain, falling near the close of the season, ripens the grain, and prepares it for the sickle. The Lord employs these operations of nature to present the Work of the Holy Spirit. As the dew and the rain are given first to cause the seed to germinate, and then to ripen the harvest, so the Holy Spirit is given to carry forward, from one stage to another the process of Spiritual growth. The ripening of the grain represents the completion of the Work of God's Grace in the soul. By the Power of the Holy Spirit the moral image of God is to be perfected in the character We are to be wholly transformed into the likeness of Christ.

The latter rain, ripening earth's HARVESI, represents the spiritual GRACE that prepares the church for the coming of the Son of man. But unless the FORMER rain has fallen, there will be no life: the green blade will not spring up. Unless the EARLY showers have done their work, the latter rain can bring no seed to PERFECTION

There is to be "first the blade, then the ear, after that the FULL corn in the ear." There must be a CONSTAND DEVELOPMENT of the Christian virtue, a CONSTAND ADVANCEMENT in Christian EXPERIENCE. This we should seek with intensity of desire, that we may ADORN the DOCIRIND of CHRIST our SAVIOUR.

Many have in a great measure failed to receive the FORMER Rain. They have not obtained all the benefits that God has thus provided for them. They expect that the LACK will be supplied by the LATTER RAIN When the richest abundance of GRACE shall be bestowed. They INTEND to OPEN their HEARTS to receive it. They are making a terrible MISTAKD. The WORK that God has BEGUN

in the human heart in giving the light and knowledge, must be continually going forward. Every individual must realize his own necessity. The heart must be emptied of every defilement, and cleansed for the indwelling of the Spirit in the latter Rain. It may be falling on hearts all around us, but we shall not discern or receive it.TM 507, 300.

At no point in our experience can we dispence with the assistance of that which enables us to make the first START. The blessings received under the Former Rain are needful to us to the END. Yet these ALONE will not suffice. While we cherish the blessing of the Early Rain, we must not, on the other hand, lose sight of the fact that without the Latter Rain, to fill out the ears and ripen the grain, the HARVEST will not be ready for the SICKLE, and the labour of the sower will have been in vain. Divine GRACE is needed at the BE-GINNING, Divine GRACE at every STEP of advance, and Divine GRACE alone can COMPLETE the WORK. There is no place for us to REST in a careless attitude. We must never forget the warnings of Christ, "WATCH unto PRAYER." "WATCH and Pray always." A connection with the Divine Agency every moment is essential to our progress. We may have had a MEASURE of the Spirit of God, but by Pray and Faith we are continually to SEEK MORE of the Spirit. It will never do to cease our EFFORTS. IF we do not progress, if we do not place ourselves in an attitude to receive BOTH the Former and the Latter rain, we shall lose our souls, and the RESPONSIBILITY will lie at our OWN DOOR.

"Ask ye of the Lord Rain in the Time of the Latter Rain." Do not (RES) satisified that in the ordinary course of the season, Rain will fall. ASK for it. The growth and perfection of the seed rests not with the husbandman. God ALONE can ripen the Harvest. But man's CO-OPERATION is required. God's Work for us demands the ACTION of our MIND, the EXERCISE of our FAITH. We must SEEK His favours with the WHOLE Heart IF the Showers of GRACE are to come to us. We should improve every Opportunity of placing ourselves in the channel of blessing. Christ has said, "Where two or three are gathered together in My name, there am I in the midst." The convocations of the church, as in campings the assemblies of the home church, and all occasions where there is personal labour for souls, are God's appoint-

ed Opportunities for giving the Early and the Latter Rain.

But let none think that in attending these gatherings, their DUTY is done. A mere attendance upon all the meetings that are held will not in itself bring a blessing to the SOUL. It is not an immuntable law that all who attend general gatherings or local meetings shall receive large supplies from heaven. The circumstances may seem to be favourable for a rich outpouring of the showers of GRACE) But God Himself command the Rain to fall. Therefore we should not be remiss in supplication. We are not to trust to the ordinary working of providence. We must pray that God will unseal the Foundation of Life. And we must ourselves receive of the LIVING WATER. Let us, with contrite hearts, pray most earnestly that now, in the TIME of the LATTER RAIN, the showers of GRACE may fall upon us. At every meeting we attend, our prayers should ascend that at this very time, God will impart warmth and moisture to our SOULS. As we SEEK God for the HOLY SPIRIT, it will WORK in us MEEKNESS, HUMBLENESS OF MIND, a CONSCIOUS DEPENDENCE upon GOD for the PERFECT-ING LATTER RAIN. If we pray for the blessing in Faith, we shall receive it as God has promised.

The CONTINUAL COMMUNICATION of the HOLY SPIRIT to the CHURCH is represented by the prophet ZECHARIAH under another figure, which contains a wonderful LESSON of ENCOURAGEMENT for us. The prophet says: "The angel that talked with me came again, and WAKED me, as a man that is wakened out of his SLEEP, and said unto me, WHAT SEEST THOU? And I said, I have looked, and behold a CANDLESTICK all of gold, with a bowl upon the top of it. and his SEVEN LAMPS thereon, and SEVEN PIPES to the seven lamps, which are upon the top thereof: and TWO OLIVE-TREES by it, one upon the right side of the bowl, and the other upon the left side thereof. So I answered and spake to the angel that talked with me, saying, WHAT ARE THESE, MY LORD?... Then he answered and spake unto me, saying, This the WORD of the Lord unto Zerubbabel, saying, "Not by MIGHT, nor by POWER, but by MY SPIRIT, saith the Lord of Hosts.....And I answered again, and said unto him, What be these two olive (BRANCHES) which through the two golden pipes empty the golden oil out of themselves....Then said he. These are the two anointed ones, that stand by

the Lord of the whole earth."

through golden pipes INTO THE BOWL OF THE CANDLESTICK, and thence into the GOLDEN LAMPS THAT GAVE LIGHT to the CANCTUARY. So from the holy ones that stand in God's presence, His Spirit is IMPARTED to HUMAN INSTRUMENTALITIES that are CONSECRATED to His SERVICE. The MISSION of the two anointed ones is to COMMUNICATION LIGHT and POWER to God's PEOPLE. It is to receive blessing for us that they stand in Gods presence. As the olive trees empty themselves into the golden pipes, so the heavenly messenger seeks to COMMUNICATE all that they receive from God. The whole heavenly treasure awaits our demand and reception; and as we receive the blessing, we in our turn are to impart it. Thus it is that the holy lamps are fed, and the church becomes light-bearer in the world.

This is this WORK that the Lord would have EVERY soul PREPARED to DO at this time, WHEN THE FOUR ANGELS ARE HOLDING THE FOUR WINDS, THAT THEY SHALL NOT BLOW UNTIL THE SERVANTS OF GOD ARE SEALED IN THEIR FORE-HEADS. There is no time for self-pleasing. The LAMPS of the SOUL must be IRIMMED. They must be supplied with the oil of GRACE. Every precaution must be taken to prevent spiritual declension, lest the great day of the Lord overtake us as a thief in the night. Every WITNESS for God is now to WORK intelligently in the LINES which God has appointed.

We should daily obtain a deep and living experience in the WORK of perfecting Christian CHARACTER. We should daily receive the Holy oil that we may impart to others. ALL MAY BE LIGHT BEARERS to the world IF they WILL. We are to SINK SELF out of sight in Jesus. We are to receive the WORD of the Lord in counsel and instruction, and GLADLY communicate it. There is now NEED for much prayer. Christ commands, "Pray without ceasing;" that is, keep the MIND uplifted to God, the source of all power and efficiency.

We may have long followed the NARROW PATH, but it is not safe to take this as proof that we shall follow it to THE END. IF we have walked with God in fellowship of the Spirit, it is because we have sought Him DAILY by faith. From the two olive trees, the golden

oil flowing through the golden pipes has been communicated to us. But those who do not CULTIVATE the spirit and habit of prayer can not expect to receive the GOLDEN OIL of goodness, patience, longsuffering, gentleness, and love.

Every one is to keep himself SEPARATE FROM THE WORLD, which is full of iniquity. We are not to walk with God for a time, and then part from His company, and WALK IN THE SPARKS OF OUR OWN KINDLING. There must be a FIRM CONTINUANCE, a PERSEVERANCE in ACTS of FAITH. We are to PRAISE God, to show forth His Glory in a righteous CHARACTER. No one of us will gain the VICTORY without PERSEVERING, UNTIRING EFFORT, proportionate to the VALUE of the object which we seek, even ETERNAL LIFE.

The dispensation in which we are now living is to be, to those that ASK, the DISPENSATION of the Holy Spirit. ASK for His Blessing. It is TIME we were more intense in our DEVOTION. To us is committed the arduous, but happy, glorious WORK of revealing Christ to those who are in DARKNESS We are CALLED to proclaim THE SPECIAL TRUTHS FOR THIS TIME. For all this the outpouring of the SPIRIT is essential. We should pray for it. The Lord expects us to ASK Him. We have not been whole-hearted in this WORK.

What can I say to my brethren in the name of the Lord! We can not depend upon form or external machinery. What we need is the QUICKENING influence of the Holy Spirit of God. "Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit, saith the Lord of Hosts." PRAY without ceasing, and WATCH by WORKING in accordance with your prayers. As you pray, BELIEVE, TRUST in God. It is the TIME of the Latter Rain, when the Lord will give largely of His Spirit. Be fervent in pray, and watch in the Spirit.
